He also stated that the Board voted to give Boswell the money for schematics. Mr. Grieco stated that it is not mandatory to have a policy to change the meeting format and that it was changed on the advice of legal counsel. He will address the snow plowing issue and safety of the drop off/pick up zone at 16th Avenue.

Mr. DeSimone explained that Boswell had to do the schematics and the State will look at the plans and allow the Board to vote on the bids.

Ms. Carolyn Chaudry, the board attorney, advised that the amended minutes did not pass.

Mr. Golabek talked about the new format for the meeting. He spoke about Governor Christie's budget address. He thanked the teachers for their hard work and for attending the meeting. He is still in favor of recording the meetings. Mr. Golabek feels it would be beneficial to have a projection for the final budget. He told the public that the bid they accepted on the masonry was way below the budget. He spoke about the article regarding Boswell and Mr. Egan. He stated that the Board was not advised in early March as Mr. Egan stated in the article. He is hopeful now that there is a new state monitor and superintendent and thanked everyone for attending the meeting.
